

Abdifatah Ahmed was fatally shot by police in Footscray on April 17 while sleeping rough. Specialist homelessness services and culturally safe supports are essential pillars in preventing such tragedies. Read Council to Homeless Persons (CHP) Statement

Between May 2023 and January 2024 four fatal police shootings and an incident of lethal use of a taser on a 95 year old woman occurred. Clare Nowland was a great-grandmother who had symptoms of dementia when she was fatally tasered by police officer Kristian White. In March this year, White was found guilty of manslaughter and sentenced to a 2 year correction order. Read Article
